From the Pastor

Just one day to pray?

The month of May brings us the National Day of Prayer, and we have hosted a 12-hour vigil here at Carmel Lutheran Church for a number of years. On the first Thursday of every May, our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the United States go to the Lord in prayer on behalf of this country. This event serves as another wonderful reminder of the freedom that we have to practice our faith without fear of punishment or persecution.

The theme chosen for our observance of the National Day of Prayer here at Carmel Lutheran is "Lord, Teach us to Pray." These words were spoken by the disciples when they saw Jesus praying. In Luke 11:1, the request comes: "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." From there Jesus gave us the Lord's Prayer. Please consider re-examining Martin Luther's *Small Catechism* and its explanation of the Lord's Prayer, either on your own or with your family at some point this month. If you don't have a Small Catechism, you can read it online: www.cph.org/t-topic-catechism.aspx.

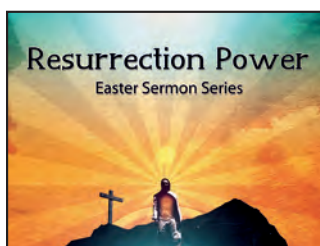
The fact that the disciples saw a need to be taught to pray points to the importance of understanding what prayer is! The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, through its Commission on Theology and Church Relations (CTCR), is regularly addressing topics that pertain to the faith which God has given us. Most recently, the CTCR released a report on prayer titled *Theology and Practice of Prayer: A Lutheran View*. This report provides a helpful explanation of prayer as "...a gift of and a response to the Gospel." I encourage all of you to consider looking through it. An online version is available at www.lcms.org/page.aspx?pid=675.

Just as we have a helpful guide to understanding prayer in this new report and in our Small Catechism, it's important to recognize that all of these resources are drawn from God's Word. We are able to approach our creating, redeeming, and sanctifying God as His own dear children as we thank Him for all that He brings us, confess our sins before Him, and ask Him to supply for our needs and the needs of others. He wants to hear from us in good times and in bad! In addition to this, we have been gifted with prayers throughout Scripture (specifically the entire book of Psalms) and prayers given to us by our ancestors in the faith as found in our hymnal (specifically The Litany on pages 288-289) and other writings. If you are looking for prayer resources, these come highly recommended! If you are looking for more ways to be involved in prayer here at Carmel Lutheran, please consider joining the Prayer Team, or being involved with the Cover our Kids program, where all of our confirmands have an adult praying for them throughout the year. (see p. 4 for more information).

God's Word and the organizers behind the National Day of Prayer encourage us to pray not just one day a year, but regularly! With the recently constructed Prayer Chapel, we now have another wonderful space to go to the Lord in prayer here at CLC. While you can certainly pray at all times and in all places, we encourage you to make use of this new area in our building. We are also regularly holding a Taizé prayer service on the first Saturday of every month in the Prayer Chapel at 7:00 p.m. (next one May 5). Make prayer an integral part of your daily life and your walk with the Lord. You will be blessed!

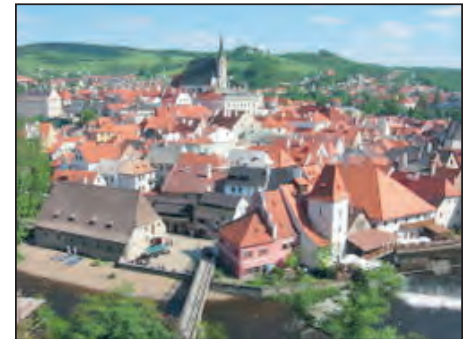

We are pleased to announce the continuation of our CLC Employment Ministry program. As the job market and available community resources have shifted over the past few years, we have found that our people are often seeking individualized assistance rather than the traditional group meetings and seminars we've hosted previously. With this in mind, we are moving forward beginning in May with just one monthly group mentoring session, which will be held on the **2nd Wednesday of each month from 7-8:30 p.m. (May 9)** at CLC. The meeting is open to all community members regardless of church affiliation and will be hosted by one or more of our volunteer team members.

During this year, we will host two Saturday workshops. The first is scheduled for **Saturday, May 19, 8:30-11:30 a.m.**, in room 102, and is entitled "Job Search 101". It will focus on the basic tools and resources for a successful job search. This session will be useful for anyone seeking a new position, looking to refresh an existing job search, or considering launching a search in the coming year. We will focus on resumes and networking career tools. A light breakfast will be served. No RSVP is required to attend.

Additional support and job seeker assistance will be provided on a one-on-one basis with our CLC Employment Ministry team members. 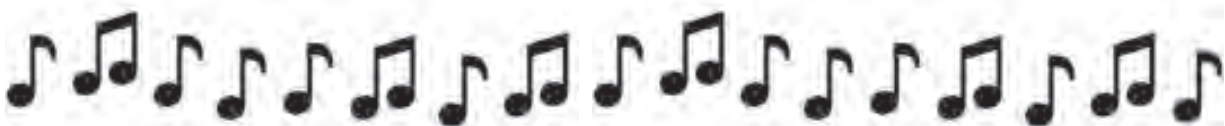
Music Ministry: Sanctuary

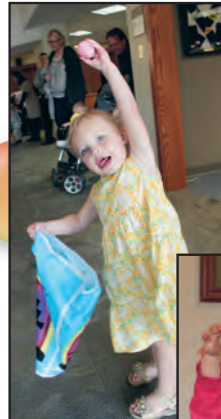

Easter Egg Hunt

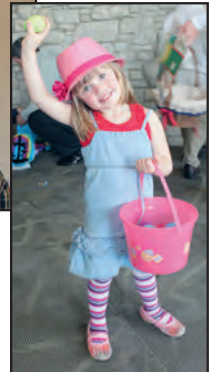
Lots of kids had egg-celent adventures collecting eggs! And, after observing their techniques, we discovered the steps to getting the best eggs:
